Outstanding A Level Results in Year 13 – Mr Baker

Congratulations to all of our Year 13 students who collected their A Level results on Thursday 17 August 2017. This year's results were our best ever and well above national average – the hard work students put in throughout the year was evident in their outcomes. Our BTEC results were also fantastic, with a pass rate of 100% pass rate and 60% of our students achieving a Distinction or Distinction*.

Our Year 13 students achieved an outstanding A Level pass rate of 100%, which is well above the national average. 15% achieved the top A*-A grades, 45% achieved the top A*-B grades and 75% achieved A*-C grades. Some of our individual subjects did exceptionally well, but particular mention should go to Art where 50% of students gained an A* grade, and Mathematics where 40% of students gained A*-A.

Outstanding GCSE results – Mrs Hatch

197 Year 11 Coopers students have been celebrating an outstanding set of GCSE results which now include the new 9-1 grading for the more challenging, “reformed” English Language, English Literature and Mathematics GCSEs. Comparisons cannot reliably be made with previous years because of these reformed qualifications, but we should particularly celebrate a remarkable 83% grades 9-4 in English (national average 60%) and 71% grades 9-4 in Mathematics (national average 61%). 4% of students achieved the highest grades, grade 9.

Our Sixth Form enrolment desk has been extremely busy and we have been able to offer most students exactly what they wanted as they achieved the entry criteria. We have had over 200 external students also apply for our limited number of places.

To highlight a few of our amazing results:

- 100% gained a C or higher in Chemistry (with 41% achieving an A or A*)
- 93% gained a C or higher in Biology (with 31% achieving an A or A*)
- 90% gained a C or higher in Physics (with 41% achieving an A or A*)
- 100% achieved a Pass or higher in ICT (with 46% achieving a Distinction or Distinction*)
- 100% achieved a C or higher in Sport BTEC
- 91% achieved a C or higher in Food Technology
- 87% achieved a C or higher in Art
- 86% achieved a C or higher in GCSE Drama
- 83% achieved a C or higher in GCSE PE
- 78% achieved a C or higher in Music
- 76% achieved a C or higher in Media

These are well above national averages.

There were also excellent results in Further Maths, Business, Geography, Electronics, French, Spanish, German, Portuguese and Turkish.

- Netra Shah five A*A, one grade 8 in Maths
- Princess Ighedosa four A*A, one Distinction*
- Rosie Frail three A*A, one Distinction*, two grade 9 in English

We are absolutely thrilled with these outstanding results. The students and staff worked so hard to achieve them. Congratulations to all!

Parent/Carer Welcome Events – Mrs Wood

As advised in the final newsletter last year, there are welcome events for all Parents/Carers and students planned for this month, where you will be issued with your child's academic report, the relevant programme of study for the year and information on how to support your child in the year to come. Parent App – Mr Carling

Information was sent to Parents/Carers during the last academic year explaining that Coopers School has been using the SIMS Learning Gateway for over six years, allowing Parents/Carers to access their child's school data anywhere and at any time, but we will be making a change this year.

A new system will be implemented with effect from this new academic year starting this September. The system, Insight from TARC software, provides a full parental engagement solution via a clear and simplified communication platform, allowing the school to share information with Parents/Carers. It has more parental engagement elements than the current system and the other systems the school tested, and it is also accessible using a tablet or mobile phone.

The new system has been installed and tested and is ready to go live. Login details will be sent to Parents/Carers by email to the primary email contact during the first week of term, together with a list of frequently asked questions.

FSM entitlement is one of the components in our school's funding and can bring a significant amount of additional money into the school. It is also worth remembering that the FSM allowance can be used to buy drinks for your child and not just meals! 

Collecting/Dropping Off Students – Mr Carling Marjorie McClure Gates and Coopers Car Park

Students are not permitted to enter and exit the Coopers site via the Marjorie McClure gates. There are many vehicles using these gates at the beginning and end of the school day and students are putting themselves in danger by using them. Please enter and exit Coopers using our own pedestrian gates.

There have also been a number of incidents of parents using the Marjorie McClure gates and trying to park in their car park. For health and safety reasons, except by prior arrangement with Marjorie McClure School, please note that there is no parking on site available in their car park.

As a member of the Chislehurst community, Coopers works hard to be good neighbour. The roads around the School get very congested at dropping off/picking up times and this can cause problems for our neighbours. Please be vigilant when waiting to collect your son or daughter, and ensure you are not blocking driveways or other access points. Please also do not use the section of road between Hawkwood Lane and the car park gate for dropping off or picking up your children as cars reversing/exiting to Hawkwood Lane cause a potential safety hazard for students.



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Messages from the Attendance Team – Miss Thurston Reporting Absence

Would parents/carers please report student absence on the dedicated School Absence Reporting line and not via Heads of Year or Form Teachers. Parents/Carers can also use the dedicated text number; full details advising how to report absences are on the School Website. Many thanks.

Requests for Leave of Absence

The Education (Pupil Registration) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013 came into force on 1 September 2013. These regulations state that the Principal may not grant leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. Family holidays do not count as “exceptional circumstances”. Absence during term time directly affects each student’s achievement. The School works with the Local Authority in improving school attendance. For your information, parents/carers who take students on holiday during term time may be referred to the Local Authority Education Welfare Service for legal consideration. Absence due to Medical/Dental Appointments

Please note missing lessons for a medical or dental appointment is counted as an authorised absence which will affect student attendance as well as missing vital work in lessons missed. Where possible, parents'/students' support in arranging appointments outside school hours is much appreciated. When this is not possible, students should only be out of school for the minimum amount of time necessary for the appointment. We appreciate if, for example, it is for a hospital appointment in London then travelling has to be taken into consideration. However, in an attempt to support an improvement in attendance students should sign in before/after medical appointments and avoid, as far as possible, taking a whole day off to attend a medical appointment. Furthermore, students should provide evidence of appointments by way of letter or appointment card; this will ensure a swift signing out process for students involved. Your support and cooperation is much appreciated.
