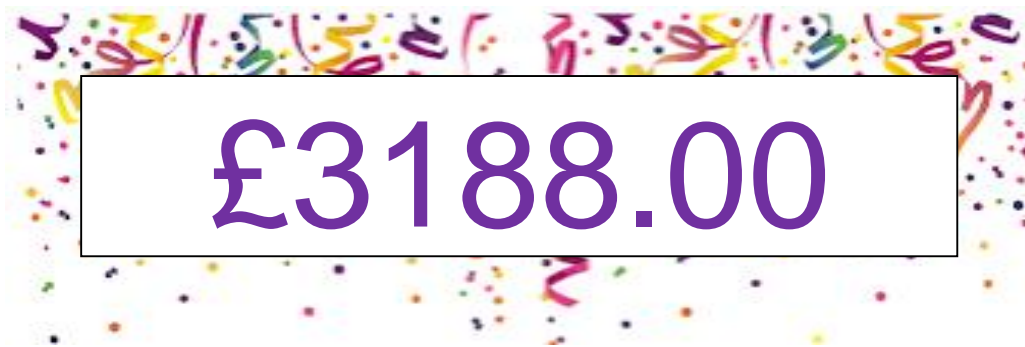

Our students had a very productive and fun day at the university where they had the opportunity to learn a bit more about the Scholars Programme they are embarking on during the summer term. They also met their



PhD Tutor who will be guiding them throughout the programme and also had their first Tutorial in a Lecture Theatre. Finally, we were taken on a tour around the university campus where students had the chance to meet some inspiring university Student Ambassadors who showed them around and were happy to answer all the questions our students had. I was very impressed with the maturity, knowledge and behaviour that our students displayed in the tutorial session and during the day. It is amazing to see how, at such a young age, they are already so excited to find out all about university life and the different career paths! ## Young Entertainers in the Community Awards – Mrs Denoon

### About the Project

The *Young Entertainers in the Community Awards* is a new annual awards ceremony that recognises and celebrates excellence and the outstanding contributions of young performers in the community between the ages of 8 to 18.

### Aims

The aim is to not only highlight the achievements and hard work of young performers, but to also encourage and inspire more young people in the local community to get involved in performing and in performing arts, and to learn more about the opportunities available to young professionals in the industry.

### History

Its big brother, *The Young Entertainers Academy Awards*, was first staged in 2003 for young professionals already making a name for themselves. Held at the Hilton Park Lane in London, the Awards were supported by TV presenter Denise Van Outen, actress and TV presenter Linda Robson, and the cast of *EastEnders*, as well as by many reputable UK theatrical agents representing young people.

### Past Award Winners

Many Award winners have gone on to achieve great things, such as singer-songwriter Pixie Lott, actor Nicholas Hoult, actor Aaron Johnson, actress Leonie Elliott and West End protagonist Tosh Wanogho-Maud, an ex-student of Coopers.

The Awards organisers are holding a fundraising event on Saturday 21 April at the Mottingham Community Centre, Kimmeridge Rd, London SE9 4EB, including a performance by the amazing Brit School from Croydon, and giving young people and their parents the opportunity to speak with talented performers.
