### Harris Academy Crystal Palace vs Coopers School

Coopers Rugby Academy had the first away match of the year at Crystal Palace under the new Head Coach Mr Moffatt. Expectations were high following a full September of preparation under the guidance of the new Coach. It was clear that Coopers were up against an athletic and well organised side when after only five minutes Coopers were only dominant in the Scrum. With two soft tries given away in the first 20 minutes, we did well defensively to ensure no other points were conceded before half time. With very little attacking opportunities taken by Coopers, it was clear there was only going to be one winner and despite some valiant tackles Harris ran away victors at 29 points to 0. A disappointing start but many things to go away and improve upon in training. Man of the Match went to Reece Tennant at Full Back whose cover tackling saved a further 15 points from being scored. ### Coopers School vs Darrick Wood School

After a disappointing first game, the team were keen to put things right in the first home game of the season. A return from a long term injury saw Sam Scott open up the score sheet with some fantastic back play that allowed Sam to use his electric pace to score Coopers' first try of the season. This put the spring back into the Coopers stride and the boys started to play with greater confidence. The patterns of play and core skills worked on by the Head Coach were far more visible to see and it was clear that the team is starting to understand the Head Coach's team structure. Both defence and attack started to function collectively and Coopers' set piece of scrum and line out enabled Coopers to build pressure and create phases of play. Darrick had their fair share of opportunities and took them but Coopers never really looked

like losing the game, playing with an air of confidence and control. A 26 – 19 win for Coopers in a really good game of rugby has lifted the team morale but, more importantly, has helped the players appreciate and understand the hard work that Head Coach Mr Moffatt has put in. There were so many contenders for Man of the Match, and it was clear that everyone had raised their level of performance by 25% from the Harris Academy game. However, Jamie Viner was awarded Man of the Match with his sniping runs and strong control of the game at Scrum Half.


