We do, however, understand that it is important to maintain traditional British dishes on the menus, such as fish and chips or a roast dinner. The rest of our menu is focussed around providing the students with access to healthy, nutritious meals that they can eat quickly and on the go.

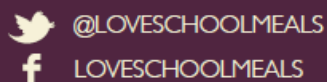

Year 9 and 10 Brilliant Club Trip to University of Sussex – Mrs Goddard

Before half term, our 2017-18 Brilliant Club cohort travelled to the University of Sussex for the launch of our three month Scholars' Programme. Our troupe of academically able students will be participating in a mini-dissertation style project exploring the role cartoons play in modern society. It is far from just watching and understanding the messages communicated by Disney and the Simpsons, encouraging students to examine, interpret and analyse cartoons used both in the press and social media. Our students will be supervised by Dr Dieter Declercq from the University of Kent, an expert in cartoons and their use in modern media.



As part of the trip, we were guided by students from the University of Sussex and explored the campus and saw what it was like to be a student studying at a top 20 university. The library was a hub of activity, with state of the art facilities, resources and of course plenty of reading material! The university library is even shaped like an open book.



Our Brilliant Club Scholars went on to attend a series of seminars and lectures on study skills and preparing for their assignments, including understanding how to reference at higher-level study. We also touched upon our initial cartoon material, exploring a cartoon showing Donald Trump dreaming of erasing the 'Obamacare' legislation. All of the students were enthused and excited about beginning the programme, and will receive more seminars in school before final submission of their projects in January 2018.
