

## Uniform Guide

White collared, formal front button up shirt (no blouses)  
School tie (Colour stripe according to House Group)  
Blue blazer with School logo and Year Group flash  
Black, grey or blue V neck jumper  
Regulation blue skirt **or** black trousers  
Black tights **or** black socks  
Black formal shoes which are either leather or leather look (boots are not allowed)  
A4 sized school bag

The following uniform expectations apply

- Students must wear the correct uniform and look smart at all times, including travelling to and from School
- Ties must be worn with school logo showing just below the knot
- White shirts must be tucked in
- Jumpers are optional; blazers are not and must be worn at all times
- Blazers must have the correct colour flash sewn on the blazer pocket
- Coats, hats, scarves and gloves must be of plain, muted colours
- Any belts should be simple, with no large buckles or logos allowed

We do not allow:

- The wearing of boots of any description (shoes should not cover the ankle) **If you are in any doubt, please contact the School before buying new shoes.**
- Canvas shoes
- The wearing of casual jumpers, hoodies or cardigans
- The wearing of trainers other than for PE
- The wearing of baseball caps
- The wearing of trousers which are combat style, jeans, denim, skinny fit or lycra
- The wearing of skirts which are styled to be too short or modified in any other way
- The wearing of footless tights or leggings
- The wearing of visible coloured T Shirts under the School uniform
- The wearing of jewellery of any type except for watches. Ear piercing should take place at the start of the six week holidays to allow for healing so that the earrings can be taken out in term time.
- Nail varnish, French Polish and nail extensions
- Nails of anything other than short length
- The wearing of leather or denim coats or jackets
- The wearing of makeup, except for Years 10 and 11 who may wear mascara.
- The use of mobile phones and music players which should be switched off during School hours
- Hair that is streaked, bleached or of an un-natural colour
- Badges other than the ones issued by the School.

- Students who arrive to School out of uniform may be sent home to change once parental contact has been made.
- The School reserves the right to respond to future fashion trends as and when they arise.
- The School accepts no liability for any student belongings that are lost damaged or mislaid whatever the circumstances.

We thank parents for supporting their child in adhering to the School uniform regulations. We remind students regularly about acceptable uniform in light of any fashion trends. It is unlikely that the above will be changed without formal notification. Please contact your child's Head of Year at School if you have any queries what isn't permitted
